Art meets business: The "Woolinale" is celebrating its Cologne debut at h+h cologne 2023

+++ Artists from all over the globe are beautifying public spaces with wool and yarn +++ With a "Peace" campaign at the festival, handicraft fans are setting a sign for peace +++

The point in time couldn't have been chosen more appropriately. The 1st International Yarn Bombing Festival "Woolinale" is celebrating its premiere at h+h cologne 2023, the leading global trade fair for textile handicrafts, which is being staged in Cologne from 31 March to 2 April 2023. Then, things will get artistic, extraordinary, creative, colourful, exceptional and surprising in and around the Cologne fair grounds as well as in front of and at the Entrance South. Because artists from all over the globe will be presenting their textile pieces of art in Cologne at the "Woolinale" that is being held in Germany for the first time.

Yarn bombers create pieces of art for public spaces - often very humorous, as original eye-catchers, but also frequently as a statement about a particular issue, which is conveyed in this unusual way and thus attracts a great deal of attention. The programme includes for instance crocheted pillars, knitted facades or railings with self-made figures sitting on them. The highlight: Many exhibits will be on display at and in front of the Entrance South and thus accessible for end consumers. In this way, interested parties, who are not allowed to attend the trade fair h+h, can experience the pieces of art close-up and let the special charm of these works of art make an impression on them.

Why yarn bombing?

The makers want to use the festival to establish among others yarn bombing as a form of art in its own right. They also want to transport the old traditions of crocheting and knitting from the home sofa into the public eye. The Woolinale team is convinced that this can be best achieved with the aid of a new form of art, the textile street art of yarn bombing. Sponsors such as the Initiative Handarbeit, addi and Schachenmayer are supporting the Woolinale team headed by Elke Hahn, Heike Unger and David with this idea.

Everyone can take part and set a sign for peace using textiles!

In addition to the works of art exhibited there is also going to be a creative joint project for all crocheting and knitting fans at the Woolinale. The organisers are setting an official sign for peace under the motto "PEACE". Everyone, who can crochet and/or knit a little really can take part here and set an official sign for peace together with other people from the large, worldwide handicrafts community.

The textile Peace statements will be collected and put together to form a huge
